

Alex Marsh



Alex Marsh is a 1990 graduate of Hillsborough High School.

While at HHS, Alex was a world-class fencer as well as an outstanding basketball player.

In fencing, as a junior in 1988, Alex was the New Jersey Fencing High School champion and was also the number one ranked under-17 fencer in the United States. Additionally, Alex competed on the world stage that year and placed tenth in the under-17 Fencing Championships in Cabries, France.

In addition to fencing, Alex was one of the most outstanding basketball players to come through

Hillsborough High School. In his senior year, Alex was elected to the 1st Team All Mid-State Conference, 1st Team All-Somerset County and 1st Team All-Central Jersey. In that same year, he was also Central Jersey's leading scorer and rebounder. Alex scored 1,189 points and collected 789 rebounds as a Hillsborough Raider Basketball player.

After high school, Alex went on to Keystone Junior College, and in 1991 he was selected as a 1st Team Junior College All-American. After remaining one more year at Keystone, Alex moved on to Gwynedd - Mercy College in 1994 and 1995 where he led the Pennsylvania Athletic Conference in scoring both of those years. In 1995, he was ranked 10th in the nation in scoring, and for his entire college career Alex scored 2,037 points and collected 1,126 rebounds.
