Matt Roberts graduated from Hillsborough High School in 2000.

Matt is arguably the most accomplished soccer player to come out of Hillsborough. He was a member of the boys' varsity soccer team for four years. During that time he earned many individual and team awards.

Individually, Matt holds a number of HHS records. He holds the record for most assists in a season by a sophomore with 23. He set the record for most goals in a season by a sophomore with 19. He is also tied with three other players for most goals scored in a game with 5. He is currently ranked 5th all-time for points with 115 which include career goals and assists. He was also named as the Most Valuable Player in his junior year of 1998. Finally, in 1999, Matt was named as an NJCAA All-American and is still the only Raider boys' soccer player to receive this honor.



For the 1997 season, Matt's team was both Skyland Conference Champion and Group IV State Sectional Champion.

Matt accomplished a great deal despite being away from Hillsborough for much of his sophomore, junior and senior years. During those years, Matt was a member of the U-16, U-17 and U-20 National teams. He is the only Hillsborough Raider to have ever represented his country playing soccer.

Upon graduating from HHS, Matt earned a full soccer scholarship to the University of Maryland. After sustaining a serious knee injury, however, Matt was unable to continue his career both collegiately and internationally.
